What Is Written and Why

We wish to look deeper into what the Bible calls 'THE CHURCH' and clarify some details regarding what it was intended to be in the eyes of God. The average person in our society today has rather loose ideas of what the church is, where it came from, and their individual association with it. In today's article, we will reveal more specific details according to Bible History and make every effort to identify God's original design of this body that Jesus called *"My church"* in <u>Matthew 16:18</u>. Remarks regarding the church cannot be properly discussed in a single article, so this will likely extend over a few weeks.

We must first agree that the Bible is the Word of God, and its purpose is to identify spiritual issues by the terms and parameters that God Himself has provided. In 2 Peter 1:2-3 the Bible reminds us that "God has given unto us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of him who has called us to glory and virtue." Furthermore, we are told in that same chapter, verses 20-21 that "Knowing this first, that no prophecy of the scripture [the truth and factual information in the book] is of any private interpretation. For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost." Also consider 2 Timothy 3:16 that tells us "All scripture is given by the inspiration of God [both new and old] and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness that the man of God may be perfect [complete] throughly furnished unto all good works."

As early as in the book of Exodus in the Old Testament, God gave specific instruction to write down His words for future reference. Look at **Exodus 17:14** where God told Moses, "write this for a memorial in a book, and rehearse it in the ears of Joshua" In **Deuteronomy 27:8** God instructed, "You shall write on the stones, all the words of this law very plainly." Also in **Isaiah 30:8** "write it before them in a tablet, and write it in a book that it may be for the time to come for ever and ever." One of those "holy men' was the prophet Isaiah, who prophesied of the Church in **Isaiah 2;2-3** "the Lord's house will be established; all nations shall flow unto it; out of Zion will go forth the Law and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem." The Church that God intended must meet all this criteria in order to be accurate by prophecy.

Get Into the Battle!

e are at war! I hope that statement didn't give you a "start", wondering how you missed that big headline this morning, because, no, we aren't in a physical war (at the moment, anyway), but if you're a Christian, we are literally in a war, a spiritual one. And everyone of us is actually on the battle line. On the one side is Satan and the world, and on the other is God and His people. You can't easily see the casualties, but they are there — those dead in their trespasses and sin, those who are wounded deeply in their guilt and regret, and the lives and homes blown up by Satan's collection of "weapons"— lies, lust, pride, materialism, and more.

So if we are in a war, how do we fight? Well, there are several things that the New Testament suggests. For example, it isn't just a cute rhetorical device that Paul is using in Ephesians 6, when he tells us to "suit up" with the armor of God. Similarly, there is a real winning strategy in the command to "stand firm" (1 Cor. 16:13; Eph. 6:11; Phil. 4:1; and others). And certainly, we can know that as we stay on the Lord's side, we are overwhelming conquerors. But what I wanted to focus on for the moment is what Paul is talking about, when he wrote by inspiration,"For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh, for the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh, but divinely powerful for the destruction of fortresses. We are destroying speculations and every lofty thing raised up against the knowledge of God, and we are taking every thought captive to the obedience of Christ" (2 Cor. 10:3-5).

The context of this passage is dealing with Paul's strategy for dealing with a list of troubles in the Corinthian church, but the principle still applies to conducting spiritual warfare on the frontlines of the workplace, neighborhood, grocery store, family gathering, school, and every other location. In essence, Paul's point is that we are in a war of ideas and one important way to wage this war is to destroy "speculation and every lofty thing raised up against the knowledge of God" and to take "every thought captive to the obedience of Christ". And boy, oh boy, these days, it's a target rich environment. Consider...

- Evolution / Darwinism
- Materialism
- "It doesn't matter what church you go to or what god you worship"

- Neo-paganism ("I am my own god/goddess")
- "Consenting adults should be able to do whatever they want to do sexually"
- "What's wrong with denominationalism?"
- "The Bible isn't accurate or inspired by God"
- "Who needs baptism? I believe, and that's enough"
- A cappella music is just a tradition, isn't it?"
- You must be anti-science, if you are a Christian"
- "How could there be a God with so much suffering in the world?"
- "How could a God of love punish someone forever?"
- "Man is just an advanced animal"
- Are Christians homophobic?
- What does the Bible say about abortion?
- "How can God be One and Three?"
- "Do Christianity and Islam worship the same God?"
- "What about gender roles and the Bible?"
- "What is marriage?"
- What proof is there of God?
- Are Christians racist?

We may sometimes find ourselves without an answer to some or even all these worldly salvos — the world is firing howitzers at us and we're just standing there. Indeed, the world has found it easier to "cancel" Christians these days, because we haven't given any thought to how we ought to respond.

But there are really good answers to these questions, and the Lord calls upon us to "...sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts, always being ready to make a defense to everyone who asks you to give an account for the hope that is in you, yet with gentleness and reverence" (1Pet. 3:15) — in other words, *get into the battle!*

Granted, this takes more Bible study than we might be used to, some serious thought, occasionally some research (try apologeticspress.org), or asking more knowledgeable brethren for how they explain or answer some of these questions — but *get into the battle!* Not only will you help to push back the darkness in the souls of friends, family, and others; but you'll find yourself spiritually stronger, more convicted in your heart about the faith, and more confident in letting your light shine.
