THE SHAME OF NOT SHARING THE TRUTH

God has provided TRUTH that can be easily learned and accepted. *1 John 5:3,* "For this is the love of God...that we keep His commandments: and his commandments are not grievous." If we value righteousness it is God's expectation that we base our righteousness upon the truth of His word which is both possible AND reasonable! The world may tell you that "The Bible is not possible to follow." This is the teaching of a lost and dying world who DO NOT wish to be told what they can or cannot do. This is the opinion of those who have no intention of obeying the word of God, have made a conscious decision to follow the ways of the world, and "influence others also".

Perhaps the most dangerous condition is the standard of God has been lowered by "popular opinion" so far that the average person has no idea of what the New Testament teaches; has no idea of what God requires and is perfectly happy in this condition! God's word says, "Awake to righteousness, and Sin not; for some have NOT the knowledge of God: I speak this to your shame." 1 Corinthians 15:34. It is the responsibility of Christians to help others by sharing the truth.

In <u>Hebrews 11:6</u> we get a glimpse of God's position toward mankind "without faith (in God) it is impossible to please God for he that cometh to God must believe that He is (God), and that He is a rewarder of those who 'diligently' seek Him." He does not suggest that we should 'casually seek Him' but that we should diligently seek Him! Our spiritual well being should be the highest priority as expressed in <u>Matt.</u> <u>6:33</u> "seek ye first the Kingdom of God and his righteousness and all these (other things) will be added unto you."

We have mentioned the conflict between good and evil from the record of <u>Genesis 3.</u> Today, I wish to bring to mind the passage in the Letter that the apostle Paul wrote to the Lord's Church in Rome regarding this same topic in the New Testament. He makes a contrast between walking in the Spirit and walking in the flesh. Look at what the inspired writer says in <u>Rom. 8:5-8</u> "They that are after the flesh...do mind the things of the flesh: but they that are after the spirit, the things of the spirit". He says that, "the Carnal (fleshly) mind is enmity against God: for it is not subject to the law of God, neither indeed can be....So then, they that are in the flesh cannot please God."



"For through Him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father. So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God." Ephesians 2:18,19

for something inaudible but very real: "The heavens are telling of the glory of God; And their expanse is declaring the work of His hands.


Day to day pours forth speech,
