"We're Here and We Care"

GOD'S PLAN, PART 9

It must be said of God, that He has a tremendous ability to anticipate human nature. Because He is a 'discerner of the hearts and intents of men' Hebrews 4:12, He inspired the authors of the New Testament to prepare spiritual writings that should attract those who "diligently seek Him" Hebrews 11:6. Under the authority and commandments of God Himself, Jesus obeyed His Father's will to death and resurrection, to instruct the apostles in the way of righteousness, and then transfer the authority for inspiration to the Holy Spirit. This is critical information in understanding the authority of the written word and the plan of God to deliver it to all generations.

Remember John 12:49, "the Father which sent me, He gave me a **commandment**, what I should say and what I should speak" In Acts 1:4, Jesus tells His apostles, "being assembled with them, He commanded them that they should not depart from Jerusalem, but wait for the <u>promise</u> of the Father." In <u>v. 8</u>, Jesus identifies the promise of the Holy Spirit and the nature of the intent, "But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Spirit is come upon you; and ye shall be witnesses of me..." Notice also <u>Acts 2:32-33</u>. Peter has begun the first Gospel sermon on the Day of Pentecost (under the Old Law) and says, "This Jesus hath God raised up...therefore being by the right hand of God, exalted (**John 7:39**) and having received of the Father the <u>promise</u> of the Holy Spirit, He hath shed forth this that ye now see and hear." [The promise to Jesus had more to do with fulfillment of God's plan, and that his death commitment had not been in vain.]

In the days during the Life of Christ, witnesses were a primary method of confirming true events. Therefore, as "witnesses of what you now see and hear" confirmed the undeniable, and allowed the apostles the assurance they used to convert the audience in <u>Acts 2</u>. Glory be to God, for the assurances He gave to us, that we have the records provided by the inspired writers. Without them, the accounts confirming the eye witness accounts, and God's plan for salvation would have been otherwise unavailable to us today.



"For through Him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father. So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God." Ephesians 2:18,19



IS IT ABOUT WHO OR ABOUT WHAT IS RIGHT?

hy do religious discussions so often turn into sectarian and divisive arguments? Is it really impossible for men to unite as Jesus clearly desires (John 17:21,22)? After a lifetime of observing religious disputes (both inside and outside the brotherhood), there's one thing in particular that seems indisputable, the controversies (even when starting off as a search for the truth) often devolve into **who's** right rather than **what's** right.

You see, when "who is right" becomes the most important thing, it dangerously puts us on a path to rejecting something that may actually be right, because

a rival or rival group approves of it. A friend of mine once had a conversation with a very conservative Protestant minister, who said something like, "If you believe anything the Catholic Church believes, you won't go to Heaven." My friend responded, "Well, they believe that Jesus is the Son of God, they believe the Bible is God's word, they believe in the Father and the Holy Spirit..." The thoughtless Protestant minister was properly silenced.

When "who is right" is most important, it puts us on a perilous path to rejecting something that may actually be allowable. The Pharisees that Jesus criticized drew increasingly tighter lines (traditions) than the Scriptures (what is right) drew, because this rabbi or that rabbi thought it would be wise.

When "who is right" becomes the most important thing, it puts us on an unsafe road to accepting something — or considering it allowable — that may actually be wrong, because my guy or my group approves of it. The Corinthian church had a man in their midst who had his father's wife, but nothing was being said to correct it; quite possibly because the transgressor may have been a man of influence in the congregation. Paul condemned such negligence of correction and called them back to what was right (1 Cor. 5).

And when "**who** is right" is the key matter, unity will never be attainable. In the Corinthian church there

were those who wanted to make Paul, Peter, or Apollos "their guy" (1 Cor. 1:12,13); but Paul rebuked the "who is right" principle and established Christ alone as the foundation (1 Cor. 3:11). The Jews and Gentiles had difficulties getting along in the first century (see especially Eph. 2), but instead of letting the arguments continue along ethnic lines, Paul emphasized unity found in what was right, God's command that we become one new man (Eph. 2:15). We're only united, when we care about what is right.

Why is this so? Men's wisdom is notoriously flawed from the days of the Garden of Eden to the days of the

Corinthians church in the Bible to the modern era. When it comes to matters of religion, there are about as many opinions as there are people. When it comes to right and wrong, there will actually be more opinions than people, because our views of right and wrong frequently change, when the standards apply to "you" or to "me" and the situations we're in. And that is the reason for the popular modern phrases "my truth", "your truth", or "their truth". Emphasizing who is right over what is right (consciously or unconsciously) will never lead to "the truth", real unity, or true righteousness.

When we care most about *what* is right, the picture changes completely; we will rightly reject the wrong, accept the right, gain real unity, and get to Heaven. This is why demanding book, chapter, and verse is so important. Don't tell me what your favorite author said; I shouldn't care what this commentator or that said about doctrine or morality; it doesn't matter what your religious group might hold as a point of doctrine. That's all about *who's* right. Instead, give me what God says about it, because that is *what* is right.

In the end, there actually is One **Who** is right — always — Jesus. It is His word that will judge us on the last day (John 12:48).
