THE JUSTICE OF GOD

There is an urgency with which I bring these messages each Lord's Day. God is not kidding about our spiritual well-being. He is not joking about the 2nd coming of Christ, and the judgment to come. The record of His justice is well documented within both the Old and New Testaments. We bring these messages to you, that you may identify your personal, Spiritual NEED! There are those who will tell you that the "love of God" is so strong that He will overlook our unrepentant sinning, and our unwillingness to abide in the truth. Grace is very real, but we must never forget the price that God and Christ paid to establish the righteousness that is offered within the Gospel (Romans 1:16,17). It is by the grace of God that He provided a means by which we can overcome the guilt and wages of sin AND the sin itself. Grace has not been given so that we would have little or no responsibility!

The same God who has given this grace is the one for whom we should "diligently seek" Hebrews 11:6. That must be worshipped "in truth and in spiritual fashion", John 4:23-24. The same one who bought us (I Corinthians 6:19-20), "know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit and ye are not your own? For ye are bought with a price; therefore, glorify God in your body and in your Spirit which are God's." There is no room for a misunderstanding the meaning of this verse; we belong to God. We are not at liberty to disregard the Word of God and invent OUR OWN moral standard. Rather, the measure to which we should be reaching is God Himself (1 Peter 1:15, 16).

God's word in <u>Matthew 7:24-25</u> says, "whosoever heareth these word of mine and doeth them, I will liken him unto a wise man, which built his house upon a rock; and the rain descended and the floods came, and the winds blew, and beat upon that house and it fell not: for it was founded upon a rock." These are the words of Jesus as he makes a point. He is not talking about how to build a house, but how to build a life; a life of value and a life of worth. A life that is based upon a moral standard that God himself has provided within the New Testament.

And God's justice will reward the righteous and hold the unrighteous accountable by His standard alone.

An Everyday Guide to Righteous Living

ouldn't it be great to have a simple guide to life? We have the Bible of course, and it gives us everything that we need to know for life and godliness. But most of us also like short, pithy guides that boil things down to easily remembered points and are able to carry us through a lot of life's challenges. Well, there is such a simple guide in Psalm 15...

O LORD, who may abide in Your tent?
Who may dwell on Your holy hill?
He who walks with integrity, and works
righteousness,
And speaks truth in his heart.
He does not slander with his tongue,
Nor does evil to his neighbor,
Nor takes up a reproach against his friend;
In whose eyes a reprobate is despised,
But who honors those who fear the LORD;
He swears to his own hurt and does not change;
He does not put out his money at interest,
Nor does he take a bribe against the innocent.
He who does these things will never be shaken.

The psalmist (David) begins by speaking about he man of integrity (v.2), whose profession of faith and walk of faith are not different. He work seeks to do right in big and small ways, seen and unseen; and he also speaks truth, when it's to his advantage and when it's not — not brutally, but in love and kindness. Are you walking the talk?

The man who will dwell in God's eternal tent will also be the man who doesn't do harm to his neighbor (v. 3). Jesus summed this up in the command to love to love our neighbor as ourselves, but this psalm seems to especially emphasize the hurtful things that can be done to one's neighbor with words. The righteous man of God doesn't slander or take up a reproach (taunting, shaming, sharply criticizing) his neighbor; nor (on the physical side of things) does any sort of evil to him. Are you loving your neighbor?

The person who will dwell on God's holy hill will be the man who honors what is right and esteems the righteous rather than the unrepentant sinful person (v. 4). His heroes are those who seek to do good, seek to honor God, seek to uphold what is right; not those who are spiritually and morally flawed, who take what they want with violence and deception. Who are your heroes?

Those who will abide with God will also be those who are faithful the their oaths — whether they advantage him or not (v. 4). Most folks would like to keep their options open and back out of commitment, if it puts them at a disadvantage; creating "escape clauses", loopholes in contracts, and prenuptial agreements — just in case. But not so with the man of God, on the path to Heaven, who keeps his word in marriage, business, and promises of all sorts. Are you faithful to your word?

Lastly, the person destined to spend eternity with the Lord is one who neither gives nor receives dishonorably (v. 5). Specifically mentioned here is not loaning money at interest (discouraged toward fellow believers), nor taking a bride (dishonest gain), or in any other way stumbles over the issue of money. The righteous person handles money well — from God's perspective. He will not be grasping and greedy, but sharing, generous, using it for the Kingdom, and providing for his family. Do you handle money like the world or like the righteous?

Psalm 15 provides a simple guide, that even the world would admire — even if they don't want to practice it. This, of course, isn't the sum total of righteousness, but it certainly sets the Christian feet on the solid ground of the path of light that leads to abiding forever on God's "holy hill" (Heaven).
