"PREACH JESUS AND HIM CRUCIFIED"

Solomon, the son of David served as King over Israel after his father. He was declared "wiser than all men" *I Kings 4:31* having been given this wisdom as a blessing from God. In *Ecclesiastes 12:13*, Solomon expresses perhaps the wisest thing he ever suggested when he said, "Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter; Fear God and keep his commandments; for this is the whole duty of man."

With this in mind, let us consider the times and look toward God for specific guidance in declaring the Gospel to the lost. The apostle Paul said it well in <u>1 Corinthians</u> <u>2:2</u>, "I determined not to know anything among you, save Jesus Christ and Him crucified." This is the ultimate message to all of mankind and infallible spiritual truth to the recipient. It is expressed throughout scripture, for example in <u>Acts 4:12</u> and <u>John 14:6</u>.

The declaration of "None other name given among men whereby we must be saved" as well as "I am the way, the truth and the life; no man cometh to the Father but by me" not only emphasizes the narrow gate that leadeth to salvation but clarifies the plan of God. It is predicated on the prophesies of God and finalized by the events on the Day of Pentecost in Acts 2. Peter declared on that Day, "Therefore, being at the right hand of God exalted...He hath shed forth this which ye now see and hear... let all the house of Israel know assuredly, that God hath made that same Jesus whom ye have crucified, both Lord and Christ." Acts 2:33-36.

Acts 13: 22-24 "He (God) raised up David...to be their king...to whom also he gave testimony, and said, I have found David, the son of Jesse a man after mine own heart, which shall fulfill all my will...of this man's seed hath God, according to His promise, raised unto Israel a saviour....Jesus: "Although the "Preaching of the cross is to them that perish, foolishness" it proves to be the most effective method of breaking through to every person who sees the value of righteousness and the personal need they have for salvation. It is the message we must deliver by every aspect of our being. There is no more powerful message, and it cannot be improved upon. It is the message we must speak and show by the lives we lead.

WHAT DOES WAITING ACCOMPLISH?

he Roman governor Felix is famously quoted in Acts 24:25 as telling the apostle Paul to go away for the moment and when he found "a convenient season" he would summon him again to hear more about the Gospel. So far as anyone knows, Felix never became a Christian—was never saved. Felix, however, is far from the first or the last to put off obedience a little longer.

Do any of these sound familiar?

- "I don't think I have to get all religious and everything to be saved. I can just live a good life and I'll make it to Heaven in the end." Salvation by good deeds is only a pretty lie. You can clean your act up. You can improve to the point of virtual "sainthood". You can give away millions to worthy organizations. You can serve leper colonies in India to the day you die. You can change the world for the better, and bring peace to the middle east (if that were even possible). You can receive plaudits from every respectable organization in the world and go down in history next to Ghandi and Mother Theresa. But without Jesus, you're still lost. You cannot "good deed" your way out of trouble. You cannot earn salvation (Eph. 2:8). Jesus is the only way to Heaven (John 14:6, please look it up).
- "I'll do it later, but right now I want to enjoy as much of life as I can." Children, who wait to obey until they can hear the heavy footsteps of a parent, are telling their parents that they not want to obey and won't until forced to. Is this not the message that we are also communicating to God, when we deliberately, habitually postpone following Jesus until "later"? Is this what you really want to say to the most powerful being in the universe? Do we think God won't see right through our willfulness?
- "I want to make sure that this is right thing to do."
 On the surface this doesn't sound like a bad reason, because we do indeed want to do the right thing, and there seem to be a lot of opinions out there about how to become a Christian. The prob

- lem is that many who use this excuse do so perpetually. No one will ever be able to see or touch God; no one in this or future generations will be witness of the resurrected lesus. The witnesses, testimonies, and evidences, however, have been around a long time and available to anyone wishing to evaluate them. So, believe already! And once faith has been established on the evidences, then the Bible makes plain the next steps (for example, in Acts 2:38), repent and be baptized in Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sin. Even the question of which church to attend is relatively simple; the list of religious organizations who preach baptism for forgiveness of sins is pretty short, and those who practice New Testament Christianity is even shorter. Be honest about the evidences, evaluate the passages that teach what one must do to be saved, and pull the trigger.
- "I want to count the cost." Again, this isn't a bad reason on the surface, but the problem is that continually being on the edge without making a commitment becomes a habit — and doom in time. The idea of counting the cost is not about figuring out whether or not you think you can bear the trials and suffering. You will be able to; the Lord will enable you. It's more about recognizing what lies ahead, steeling yourself for the sacrifice, taking a deep breath, and committing yourself to the Son of God who suffered and died for you. Take a little while (but only a little while), and let it register that, like the merchant who found the pearl of great price (Matt. 13:45, 46), no price is too great for obtaining the Kingdom of Heaven.

There's nothing to be accomplished by stalling. It amounts to playing Russian Roulette with your soul. The best advice ever given to a sinner was given by a man named Ananias to Saul of Tarsus, "'Now why do you delay? Get up and be baptized, and wash away your sins, calling on His name.'" Acts 22:16, NAS95.
