THE MOST SIGNIFICANT OF DATES

I have been intrigued by the facts concerning the History of the Bible, it's people and God's Plan for salvation. I was troubled that this information is not easily found within direct scripture. This is largely due to the lack of more sophisticated calendars that reference years, months or days during the time 'Before Christ' (BC). There are specific days that are clearly defined such as the *"first day of the week"* that is referenced in <u>Acts 20:7</u> and <u>1 Corinthians</u> <u>16:2</u> as well as the "Sabbath Day" (7th day) which was observed as the 'day of rest' under the Old Law.

Other days are identified by seasons, moon phase, planting of crops and harvest. For example, in *Exodus* **<u>12:1-2</u>** (as the Children of Israel were about to leave Egypt) God said "this month shall be unto you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you." In Exodus 23:15, God instructs Moses, "Thou shalt keep the feast of unleavened bread...in the time allotted for the month Abib" (Nissan). Deuteronomy 16:1 says, "Observe the month of Abib, and keep the passover unto the Lord thy God, for in the month of Abib the Lord thy God brought thee forth out of Egypt." (largely considered the first full moon after the Vernal equinox-the planting moon. With no calendar, it was a method of time reference.) By God's word, it was the time Jesus observed the passover feast with His Apostles, at which time Jesus introduced the Lord's Supper. Luke 22:7-20

Time is of interest to us as we study the Bible because it helps us more clearly understand the historical events that God prophesied and performed to get us to Christ. The historical events can also confirm the truth and accuracy of prophecy and secular History. One of the most significant dates is the establishment of the Church in the year 33 AD <u>Acts 2</u>. From this, we know the age of Jesus at the time of his death, and the significance of time stamped 'AD'. Many of us were taught that the AD added to a date meant "<u>After</u> <u>Death</u>". It is actually a Latin term, "anno domini" that means, "in the year of our Lord". It is the time of His birth...the most significant of dates to recall!

A word of Encouragement


"For this reason we must pay much closer attention to what we have heard, so that we do not drift away from it." Hebrews 2:1, NAS95.

MISSED OPPORTUNITIES

e have all missed opportunities — career opportunities, relationship opportunities, investment opportunities, purchase opportunities — that kept us up at night and caused us to kick ourselves over and over again. Opportunities are basically openings in circumstances that make it possible for us to act and get something we want — a raise, a promotion, a relationship, a material gain.

But have you ever considered that there have been other opportunities that we have missed that may have eternal ramifications? What about opportunities to do good for others? Opportunities to serve

God? Opportunities to obey? Opportunities to grow spiritually? These are opportunities, too; but when we miss these opportunities, do we kick ourselves that we didn't "seize the opportunity"? Probably not as often.



"But it will be more tolerable for Tyre and Sidon in the judgment than for you." Luke 10:14.

Some of these missed spiritual opportunities that will be judged include, for example, the ones in which we had the opportunity to recognize and obey the Lord, but deliberately chose not to do so, like in Luke 10:14. Here lesus rebuked the local towns around Galilee — where He had healed multitudes, performed miracles, revealed God's word - that had not believed in Him. It was a grave missed opportunity — and a cause for judgment that would actually make the wicked and pagan cities of Sodom, Tyre, and Sidon look good by comparison! And people still miss such opportunities. That's why the writer of Hebrews tries to urge his readers to return to the Lord "Today" (Hebrews 3:13-15). I'm reminded here of an old invitation song, "Almost Persuaded" — a poignant hymn about the opportunity of salvation missed by putting it off. Don't miss this opportunity to recognize and obey the Lord for salvation!

But there are other ways to miss opportunities...

"But do you suppose this, O man, when you pass judgment on those who practice such things and do the same yourself, that you will escape the judgment of God?" Romans 2:3.

Without a doubt knowing what is pleasing to God was a tremendous advantage to the Jews, but Paul notes that such knowledge — especially in contrast to the Gentiles, who didn't have the Law — only incriminated them in God's sight all the more. What a great warning to us today. Far from being a chain that enslaves us (Satan's lie), the Bible is light, illumination, a guide, and freedom! And what an inconceivable op-

portunity is missed when we — though knowing it — ignore it. To know about functional and godly marriage and family from the Bible, yet choosing our own way — what a missed opportunity! To know about the pattern of salvation or

worship or the faith that pleases God, and yet to choose what might be popular or entertaining instead — what a missed opportunity! And such missed opportunities not only rob us of joy here, but Heaven later, because they constitute rebellion against the Lord, deliberate sin.

No wonder, then that James writes...

"Therefore, to one who knows the right thing to do and does not do it, to him it is sin." James 4:17

James, in characteristic directness, points out that seeing the good that one might do and passing up the opportunity is sinful. The opportunities to show God's love, be a good Samaritan, speak an encouraging word, or take a stand of courage with God, when deliberately missed, are sin. It's something to think about, isn't it. When we put off — because of laziness, complacence, poor priorities, or some petty reason — and miss the opportunities of believing, obeying, attending church, share the Gospel, doing good to others, etc. the Bible says that we will held to account.

We need to take Paul's inspired advice (Colossians 4:5), "making the most of the opportunity" of every type that God sends our way.
