A PLAN FOR RECONCILIATION

As early as Genesis 3 in the Bible historical record, a reference is made to God's Plan for Salvation. In <u>Genesis</u> <u>3:15</u>, God makes a simple reference to the continual conflict. God said, *"I will put enmity between thee and the woman* (to whom Satan first offered the fruit), and between thy seed and her seed; it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel."

Three things stand out;

- 1. Enmity (hostility to the point of hatred) between Satan and man.
- 2. The enmity would extend to generations to come; no time limit given.
- 3. The harm inflicted by Satan to the descendant of the Woman would be superficial (*bruise the heel*): the harm inflicted to Satan would be catastrophic or terminal (*bruise the head*)

The implication here is a reference to Jesus, the Son of God: born of woman as the Savior of the world. Jesus would make His stand against evil, but he was destined to die upon the cross. Although this would seem (at first glance) as defeat, we know NOW that Jesus was raised on the 3rd day, and has taken his place in 'Glory' at the right hand of God. Satan, on the other hand, will suffer a tremendous loss and a permanent place in torment. Until that time, Satan is at liberty to live and work on the Earth until Jesus comes again. The Plan reached a milestone with the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus, but several hundred years transpired before this significant spiritual event. It is important to understand that everything from 'The Fall' until the Resurrection of Christ was planned and controlled by God. The record of these events is greatly published in the Old Testament. It is a wonderful, historical record of what was written to bless men by the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Insight can be gained of God's purpose and plan within the writings of the Old Testament, but was never intended to last beyond the glory of Christ. For example, read <u>Galatians 3:21-25</u> where the Bible says, "If there had been a law given which could have given life, verily righteousness should have been by the law... the law was our schoolmaster to bring us unto Christ". In order to please God, it is imperative that we clearly identify His <u>requirement</u> <u>of us today</u>....and confirm it with Scripture. <u>Hebrews 1:1-2</u> reminds us that, "God...spake in times past by the prophets...hath in these last days spoken to us by His Son."

How Safe Is Your God?

ow safe is God? I'm not talking about the security of the saved; That's super secure. I'm asking, "How safe it is to follow the Lord?" It is an important question because sometimes the God we really want is all about safety, security, no boat, rocking, even keeled, harmless, and benign. And sometimes we're disappointed when things aren't that way. Times when we're thrown a curveball, and God doesn't stop it. When God doesn't give us all the resources, we think we need to do what seems to be as well. When God commands us to do things that aren't exactly safe, in fact, they're downright risky. When he calls on us to challenge the worldliness around us or the status quo of lukewarm discipleship. My point is that sometimes God is not safe, He is always good; but sometimes He's not safe at all. And yet we want safe.

In Judges 6 the Midianites had invaded and raided Israel like locusts. Israel was without a central government or army, and consequently, it was easy prey. Israel cried out to God, and God, sent a prophet to point out the problem, sin. Israel repented, and then God sent an angel of the Lord to Gideon, who was standing in a wine press, fearfully threshing wheat in secret. The angel of the Lord said, "Hail, mighty warrior!" I don't think timid Gideon could have been more surprised! But would you be surprised to hear, that the Lord still comes to to us — even the timid looking for might warriors?

Gideon was looking for a low profile. He was threshing grain — in a wine press. The place to thresh grain was on hilltops, so the chaff would blow away in the wind; but wine presses were almost always at the bottom of the hill. But Gideon didn't want to be on top of the hill; it would be too easy for the Midianites to see him up there; he wanted to keep a low profile and not draw any attention to himself. Sound familiar? Granted, it's sometimes easier to "come out" as a homosexual than a Christian these days, but the Lord is still looking for the mighty warrior in us. Matthew 5:14-16 tells us that we are the light of the world, not meant for hiding under bushel baskets. Discipleship isn't about cowering in the wine presses, but threshing wheat on the hilltops, through servanthood, giving glory to God, refusing to be ashamed of the Lord, and sharing the gospel with others without apology or embarrassment.

Gideon also wanted peaceful coexistence with idols and their worshipers. There was an idol right within the town that belonged to his father and was worshipped by most of the townspeople, but God commanded that Gideon tear it down and build an altar to the true God. Don't you know that stirred things up? But aren't we also tempted to prefer the "god" of peaceful coexistence? Of moral tolerance? It has been rightly said that all it takes for evil to triumph is for good men to do nothing. Let us, therefore, speak up for Jesus, speak up for truth, speak up for what's right. If evil grows stronger, never let it be said that it was because we failed to speak up.

Gideon wanted a real army. The Spirit of the Lord moved Gideon to put out a call to arms against the Midianites in the valley of Jezreel. The Midianites had about 120,000 soldiers, but the Israelites could only muster an army of 32,000. Nevertheless, the Lord said that was too many-tell the fearful to go home, and so 22,000 left, leaving only 10,000. But that was still too many. Let the people drink, the Lord said, and afterward 9700 went home leaving only 300. Can't you hear Gideon saying, "Excuse me? 330 versus 120,000? Can I have a real army now?" Would we prefer a "real army", too? The proper resources? Sometimes our faith is tested to prefer the "god" of tangible resources and assets. And to be honest, God *has* provided us with a lot of resources in this congregation, but sometimes those blessings can be addicting, because they're safe and secure. But following God means taking on higher risks, projects with few or no tangible assets or resources, but Paul tells us why God may lead us that way sometimes. "For the sake of Christ, then I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities; for when I am weak that I am strong" 2 Corinthians 12:10.

We probably do not think of ourselves as mighty warriors, but that is exactly what the Lord calls us to be. So let us march forward in faith, seeking the high rather than the low profile. Seeking no peaceful coexistence with the idols and the immorality of this world. And being content with the resources that God grants us.
