I. INTRODUCTION

- A. Caleb is a fascinating character
 - 1. We don't get to know much about him, except...
 - a) The story of the spies
 - b) The story of Hebron
 - 2. But the stories of Caleb are full of faith and fire!!
 - a) Reflecting a possible translation of his name
 - (1) More than "dog"
 - (2) ISBE suggests "mad dog"
 - b) You gotta love a Bible hero named "mad dog"
- B. "But my servant Caleb, because he has a different spirit and has followed me fully, I will bring into the land into which he went, and his descendants shall possess it." Numbers 14:24, RSV.

II. HAD A DIFFERENT SPIRIT

- A. Contrasted with Israel's spirit of...
 - 1. Timidity
 - 2. Caution

B. Caleb was

- 1. Courageous
- 2. Willing to throw caution to the wind (if God was involved)!!
 - a) Not foolhardy; he didn't follow repentant Israelites into the land after God told them no.
 - b) He knew where the ability came from!!
 - c) Willing to throw caution to the wind

C. God, make us more like Caleb, full of faith and fire!

- 1. In our worship
- 2. In our evangelism
- 3. In our love for each other
- 4. In our giving
- 5. In our work for the Master and His church
- 6. In our following the vision
- 7. God, make us "mad dogs" for Your service!

III. FOLLOWED ME FULLY (WHOLEHEARTEDLY)

A. Israel's obedience was a mixed, half-done bag...

- sometimes obeying, sometimes not; sometimes obeying tentatively, halfheartedly
- 2. Complaint, resistance, and second-guessing God was part of their regular M.O.
- 3. Doubt that failed, no matter how many ties god provided or rescued them, to believe
- 4. Leaving God's will ignored and undone
- B. Caleb understood real faith real faith goes "all in"
 - 1. Illus Poker
 - a) if you've been dealt an unbeatable hand
 - b) you shove all your chips into the middle all in!
 - 2. Caleb was confident that with God on their side, they had an unbeatable hand and he was "all in" no need to hold anything back
 - 3. There weren't any half-measures with Caleb
 - 4. He also understood that partial obedience was really disobedience
 - 5. So, when God commanded...
 - a) Wait for Moses to come off the mountain? OK!
 - b) Don't pick up manna on Sabbath? OK!
 - c) Follow Moses, not Aaron, Miriam, or Korah? OK!
 - d) Attack Canaan from the south? OK!
 - e) he followed...
 - (1) whole-heartedly
 - (2) obediently
 - (3) unflinchingly
 - (4) unhesitatingly
 - (5) full-tilt
 - (6) LIKE A "MAD DOG"
- C. We, also, must follow the Lord fully—wholeheartedly
 - 1. We follow the same God, who still provides and saves
 - a) Would the Lord's hand be shortened just as we are on the threshold of accomplishing great things for His glory?
 - b) BY NO MEANS!!
 - c) Sometimes the only thing standing in our way to great things for the Master...
 - (1) is not the circumstances
 - (2) is not the Lord
 - (3) IS US!!

 - 1. whole-heartedly
 - 2. faithfully

- A. Caleb ("Mad Dog"):
 - 1. I'm 85 and I'm claiming God's promise to me,
 - 2. Give me Kiriath-arba (Hebron) city of giants
 - a) Not only was Caleb not ready to retire, he wasn't even ready to slow down!!
 - b) He was looking for challenges!!!!
 - 3. Just as an observation...
 - a) Can you imagine how that had to inspired the younger folks?!
 - b) Illus my first golfing experience with the old men in front of me
 - c) What great courage, inspiration, dedication, and challenge this must have given them
 - d) "If that old man can do it, I know I can do better!"
 - e) You gotta love ol' "Mad Dog"
- B. Too often we look for the easy way, the rose-garden, the cake-walk
 - 1. But great victories don't come to those seeking the easy way
 - 2. Great victories come to those willing to "take on the giants", the challenging projects.
 - 3. And my older brothers and sisters, we need to be leading the way
 - a) not just pointing the way
 - b) not just suggesting the way
 - c) not just exhorting the way
 - d) LEADING THE WAY, just like ol' "Mad Dog", Caleb
- C. May God help us to be willing to take on "giants" like Caleb, full of faith and fire!
