LETTER TO THE CHURCH IN SARDIS

• A little history — Sardis is the home of the famous king



Croesus ("rich as Croesus"). The high city was set on a mountain spur 1500 feet from the valley floor. The mountain itself was composed of crumbly stone. Almost the only way into the city was across a narrow ridge, making the city almost impregnable. In fact, Sardis felt so secure, when Cyrus the Mede came to conquer the city, they didn't even bother posting guards or lookouts. But a sharp eved soldier noticed a Sardian soldier drop his helmet from

the wall and go down and fetch it, and that night the Persians followed that way up the mountain and found the walls and city unguarded and the city asleep. That's bad enough, but the very same thing happened again a couple hundred years later with Antiochus, one of Alexander the Great's generals.

successor, Attalus II (159-138 BC), whose loyalty earned him the nickname, "Philadelphos", literally meaning "one who loves his brother". One of its apparent purposes was to propagate Greek language and culture further inland to the bordering kingdoms of Phrygia and Mysia. It was also a city of earthquakes, causing quick abandonment of their stone buildings at every tremor.
