# THE MEASURE OF RIGHTEOUSNESS

I trust that each of us has performed a test of measuring our faith and belief by Scripture. Naturally, we should all strive to compare our present 'spiritual' status with the standard God has given us by inspiration that we may get an idea of how we "measure up". In **2 Corinthians 10** there is an interesting series of remarks by the apostle Paul regarding this very standard. It is interesting to follow the 18 verses, in which Paul is declaring the justification of the power and authority given to them by God Himself. The following is a synopsis of what is written for us to review (in part):

"[T]hough we walk in the flesh, we do not war after the flesh [for the weapons of our warfare is not carnal (fleshly) but mighty through God] casting down...every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ: having a readiness to revenge all disobedience...which the Lord has given us for edification and not for destruction...for we dare not make ourselves of the number, or compare ourselves with some that commend themselves: but they measuring themselves by themselves, and comparing themselves among themselves, are not wise: But we will not boast of things without (beyond) our measure, but according to the measure of the rule which God has distributed to us, a measure to reach even unto you. For not he that commendeth himself is approved, but whom the Lord commendeth".

Many will discount the ideas taught within these verses on the basis of "being confused" or that the meditation sought by these ideas are difficult and have "little or no affect" upon the average Christian. However, as the recipients of this inspired scripture, let us not be too quick to discount the message. Paul is explaining two things to us: 1. The 'rule' as a source of authority (those who have the responsibility of authority as in "rulers in spiritual matters") and 2. A source of measurement for spiritual standards, much like the 'ruler' which is accepted as a standard of measurement for 12 inches

The lesson is two-fold: all spiritual and religious authority is exclusive to God, and the measurement is based upon the standard that has been given. We should always measure ourselves by God's standard, and do so on a regular basis.

# BURYING THE LEAD

urying the lead" is a phrase that comes out of the news reporting business. Whether it's a newspaper or TV or radio broadcast, the news editor has to decide which news stories are the most important and which are of lesser importance. The most important news gets the headline in the paper, and in the broadcast world, the most important news is the first story to be reported — the lead story. Once in a while a really important story, by miscalculation or bias, gets "buried" below the fold or somewhere else less prominent — or in the broadcast world, gets reported toward the end with very little air time. That's "burying the lead".

To illustrate in a more relatable way, can you imagine this? A husband comes in from work and says, "I saw the cutest cat picture today on Facebook, it was hilarious. And I saw your friend Susie at lunch today; she says hi. I hear we may get a little rain tonight. And oh yeah, by the way I got a pretty big promotion and raise today and we're moving to San Francisco." That's also "burying the lead".

Bringing this idea over to spiritual matters, do we sometimes "bury the lead" of the Good News of the Gospel? Sometimes we miscalculate the importance of the Good News of the Gospel. This can happen when the things of this world have become too important — when TV shows, sports scores, careers, local gossip, politics, and the newest model of your favorite car become the exclusive "lead stories" in our daily interactions with family, friends, and colleagues. But of course, such a typical devaluation of the Gospel could not be further from the truth; it is truly super-important. Not only does Romans 1:16 tell us that the power of salvation is the Gospel, but Romans 10:14 explains it logically, "How then will they call on Him in whom they have not believed? How will they believe in Him whom they have not heard? And how will they hear without a preacher?" Don't bury the lead by miscalculating the superlative importance of this Good News.

But even if we are personally convinced of the importance of the Gospel, we often have another barrier to overcome, our belief that our family, friends, and colleagues will have no interest in this news. Sometimes this is true, but not always. In fact, in my experience everyone has an interest in their soul at some point in their life — even the people that we'd usually judge as having no interest whatever. Take, for example, people like Matthew the tax collector, Zaccheus, the chief tax gatherer, and the Christian persecutor, Saul of Tarsus. Did you know that

gang members have occasionally become Christians? It may be true that many folks may not be interested in the most important news ever heard, but we dare not make that decision for them, do we?

And one other barrier to overcome is sometimes that we assume that the people, to whom we could be telling the truth of the Gospel, have already heard it. But once again, this may not be true at all. There are still many an "Apollos" among the friends, family, and acquaintances that we have, people who have heard some of the truth, but need to know the rest of it. Most religious groups teach some of the truth; but people from those groups need to hear the sum of the truth. Our missionary to India recently converted over 200 denominational preachers, who hadn't heard the complete truth and responded in obedience to it. Don't bury the lead with those who haven't heard "the whole counsel of God" (Acts 20:27). Share with them the truth that there is more to the story than they know.

We don't have it as a hymn in our present songbook, but the title and words of *You Never Mentioned Him to Me* have always moved me. In case you're not familiar with it, the first verse goes...

When in the better land,
And Before the bar we stand,
How deeply grieved our souls will be,
If any lost one there
Should cry in deep despair,
"You never mentioned Him to me!"

"You never mentioned Him to me! You helped me not the light to see. You knew me day by day, And knew I was astray, Yet never mentioned Him to me."

How many people do we see, interact with, visit with, are related to, lived next door to, chat with, eat dinners with, go to games with, work with, shop with, or play with day after day — yet never talk about the Savior with, never invite to church, or never talk about your faith with? And yet, day by day we all get one day closer to death or the second coming of the Great Judge of all mankind.

While the word "gospel" in Greek is translated "good news" it is actually much more — not better, not great, but the best news. Don't "bury the lead"!


