CHALLENGE TO PROVE GOD RIGHT

Do you believe spiritual people think about spiritual things on a daily basis? Do we measure the things we think and say by Biblical standards? It's a pretty heavy burden to be held accountable for every-day comments and casual responses when spoken to. However, it is only a burden when we struggle with obedience. One of our best tools in 'honing our daily Christian Skills' is written in **Philippians**2:1-5 "let each esteem other better than themselves".

It is doubtful that the average Christian would be guilty of lying, cheating, or robbery but may have a challenge treating others with respect in all circumstances. <u>Hebrews 5:12-14</u> is a wonderful measure of personal obedience and Faith. Note the words: "when for the time ye ought to be teachers (including all that we come in contact with) ye have need that one teacheth you again which be the first principals of the oracles of God; and are become such as have need of milk, and not of strong meat. For everyone that useth milk is unskillful in the word of righteousness; for he is a babe. But strong meat belongeth to them that are of full age, even those who....by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil."

If this seems to be a greater challenge than achievable, please consider <u>I Peter 3:15</u> which instructs us to "sanctify the Lord God in your hearts, and be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that lieth in you with meekness and fear". It takes dedicated effort of both study and meditation to achieve, but the rewards are great. It requires a great deal less effort than one might think in order to achieve this level of scripture knowledge.

A word of encouragement: the Holy Spirit is the earnest of our inheritance. He is provided of God, and has power to help us in prayer and in service. Do not be surprised when the word of the Lord comes to you more easily and your effectiveness to influence others in a positive, spiritual way is much more automatic. However, never forget that the successes are in direct proportion to the amount of "by reason of use" that gets applied. This is a challenge to prove God right.

WORKS OF THE FLESH AND FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT, PART 8

he last few weeks we've been giving a little deeper thought to the fruit of the Spirit. While we probably know the basic meaning of these qualities, I hope we've all been encouraged to reflect and examine ("fruit inspection" as it were) the fruit of the Spirit in our own lives. This last look will concentrate on the last three aspects of the fruit of the Spirit, which Paul lists in Galatians 5 — faithfulness, gentleness, and self control.

Faithfulness

This aspect of the fruit of the Spirit has to do with loyalty to God and reliability of obedience to Him. It is the quality of a steward that allows a master to never need worry about how the affairs of his house are being run. It is the word Jesus used in a parable in Matthew 25:21,23 of the servants who used their stewardships wisely, "Well done, good and faithful slave". It is the kind of man to whom the teachings of "the Faith" should be entrusted (2 Timothy 2:2). In Paul's writings it is the quality of a statement that the hearer can absolutely rely upon (e.g., 1 Tim.1:15; 1 Tim. 3:1; 1 Tim. 4:9; et al). It is also said of those who chose to die rather than deny their Lord Jesus (Rev. 2:10 and 3:14). And it is said of God who called us into the fellowship of His Son (1 Cor. 1:9). It is this loyalty, reliability, and trustworthiness that the Spirit of God seeks to produce in the Christian. This is a man whose word can be trusted, whose loyalty can be relied upon, and who would rather die than deny the Lord who redeemed him.

Gentleness

The Greek word is *praus* and is difficult to translate precisely. The classical Greek writers defined it as the middle between the extremes of passion and apathy or between pride and abject degradation or between violent grabbing and completely hands-off, etc. Bible translators have used meekness, courtesy, modesty, and gentleness to try to express the meaning—all of which are trying to find a word to express the concept of "appropriate restraint". This fruit of the Spirit is about finding "appropriate restraint", especial-

ly in human relations. This makes sense of passages like Galatians 6:1 "Brethren, even if anyone is caught in any trespass, you who are spiritual, restore such a one in a spirit of *gentleness*; each one looking to yourself, so that you too will not be tempted", or 2 Timothy 2:24,25 "The Lord's bond-servant must not be quarrelsome, but be kind to all, able to teach, patient when wronged, with *gentleness* correcting those who are in opposition, if perhaps God may grant them repentance leading to the knowledge of the truth", and other similar passages.

Self Control

This Greek word means to be in possession of something, physical or otherwise. In this moral and ethical sense it describes the strength of spirit in which a man grasps and maintains control of himself: his desires, his emotions, his lusts, and his passions. It is critical to realize, however, that self control is not merely holding back from giving in to the works of the flesh; it is more. Self control must be exercised in two important ways: keeping the Christian from certain sinful things, but also motivating him to deliberately engage in commanded things. Christianity is not merely the religion of "no"; it is also about "yes" to God commands — even the difficult ones. It is true that self control will say no to the temptations of, for example, sexual sin; but it will also press us to be deliberately active in, for another example, practicing gentleness. Indeed, self control is the foundation for so many aspects of the fruit of the Spirit.

So, about your discipleship...are you living by the Spirit, walking by the Spirit, and producing the fruit of the Spirit? It makes a difference: Ga 6:7,8 "Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, this he will also reap. For the one who sows to his own flesh will from

the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life." Don't let the weeds of the works of the flesh choke out the good fruit the Spirit wants to produce in your life.


