### THE TEMPLE TRANSITION, PART 6

There is a reference made last week to Hebrews 9:7-8, "the Holy Ghost this signifying, that the way into the 'Holiest of All' was not yet made known while the first Tabernacle was yet standing." We know that the Temple was still standing until the year AD70, at which time it was destroyed, even to the plowing under of the corner stones, Matthew 24:2, "there shall not be one stone left upon another, that shall not be thrown down."

Although we can understand clearly that the tearing of the Temple veil leading into the Most Holy Place was representative of the end of 'Temple significance', we can also envision that the Most Holy Place was "signifying the Holy Ghost". While the Most Holy Place gave the Children of Israel 'access to the Father' (upon the Mercy Seat, above the Ark of the Covenant, between the Cherubim), the New Covenant, purchased with the blood of Jesus, would provide access to the Father in a new and much different way. This is truly the 'Temple transition' we have been discussing!

To gain the intent, we look at John 14:16-17, "I will pray the Father, and He shall give you another Comforter...even the Spirit of Truth...". Luke 24:49, "I send the promise of my Father...but tarry ye in the City of Jerusalem, until ye be endued with power from on high". Acts 1:4-8 "being assembled together with them, commanded them that they should not depart from Jerusalem, but wait for the promise of the Father...ye shall be baptized with the Holy Ghost not many days hence...ye shall receive power after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you."

Matthew 16:18-19 is to be fulfilled in precisely in this manner. The "keys to the Kingdom", the unlocking of the Mysteries of God would be provided from God - through the Son – by the Holy Ghost. (John 12:48-49, "the word that I have spoken will judge you in the last days…the Father which sent me gave me a commandment, what I should say and what I should speak.")

John 14:25-26, "These things I have spoken to you, being yet with you. But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in my name, He shall teach you all things, and bring to remembrance, all things whatsoever I have spoken to you." The Word of God provided to man by Inspired writers.

### "DO NOT QUARREL ON THE JOURNEY."

A fter years of slavery, imprisonment, and finally vindication and incredible promotion, Joseph finally had to chance to confront the very men, his own brothers, who had sold him to traders on their way to Egypt. It was clearly (we're told by the text itself) an emotional event for Joseph. Nevertheless, as was typical of his life up to this point, he did what was right, regardless of the temptations and tearfully and sincerely forgave his brothers, who showed themselves deeply regretful for their treachery toward their younger brother.

As Joseph sent them off to tell Jacob, their father, that Joseph was still alive, was (as it were) prime minister of all of Egypt, and that the whole family should move to Goshen (in the delta of the Nile River in Egypt) he tells them (Gen. 45:24), "Do not quarrel on the journey." It was definitely good advice.

They already seemed to have been quarrelsome lot before all this. Can you imagine what the conversations must have been like on the road back home?

"Whose idea was it to sell Joseph? Reuben, wasn't that you?"

"Well yeah, but you guys wanted to kill him and dump his body into a pit somewhere. I said we should just throw him in a pit, because I wanted to rescue later him from you guys!"

"Yeah, but whose idea was it to kill him?"

"And by the way, who's going to tell dad? Not me, I'm telling you right now. He's going to hit the roof, I think the one whose idea it was to kill him should be the one to tell him."

"No, it should be the one who said to sell him. Reuben that was you!"

"No, that was actually Judah! Remember, I just wanted to throw him in the pit and rescue him while you guys weren't looking."

"Oh sure, always the goody-two-shoes"

Joseph realized before his brothers did that this was going to be a tough and troublesome trip home, even if was to bring some pretty great news. He knew that this was a time for forgiveness, introspection, repentance, humility, and lessons learned — not recriminations, strife, ducking of responsibility, rationalization, and fear. Family was too important, the news was too good, and the circumstances and outcome was (as he told them twice) used by God to save the whole family from the famine.

And it remains good advice today as well.

How many marriages and families could benefit from this advice, "Do not quarrel on the journey"? There will always be disagreements, but they need to be addressed and permanently disposed of quickly. Apology, forgiveness, and love are major tent poles of happy, permanent families. Troubles will come and must be overcome by families working together on the problem rather than "shooting" at each other as if loved ones were the enemy.

As Christians added by the Lord Himself to the household of God we too — as recovering human beings — find ourselves occasionally in conflict with one another. Thankfully, it is seldom anything as extreme as selling our brother into slavery, but whether it is a major or minor matter, it must be solved with brotherly love and for the sake of the kingdom, "Do not quarrel on the journey." Disagreements will inevitably happen, despite our best efforts; Paul's letters to first century churches testify to inescapability of conflicts, but they also testify to the fact that there are good, godly, quick, and permanent solutions — if we'd only apply them. Conflict in church calls for forgiveness, introspection, repentance, humility, and lessons learned — not recriminations, strife, ducking of responsibility, rationalization, and fear. Family is too important, the Gospel is too good to get bogged down in strife, and every circumstance and outcome can be worked out for good by God (Romans 8:28).
