"We're Here and We Care"

GOD'S PLAN — PART 26

We indicated last week that we would investigate more regarding the Holy Spirit, and the part he was intended to play in God's Plan. It is a very interesting event to review in scripture. We will take it up beginning with Jesus' resurrection in *John 20:17* where He instructs Mary "not to touch Him for he had not yet ascended unto the Father." This was not the ascension described in <u>Acts 1:2</u>, but an apparent 'interim' ascension before spending 40 days with His Apostles upon the earth. Notice in <u>John 20:26</u>, that Jesus met with His Apostles "after 8 days" at which time he allowed Thomas to touch Him. We know that Jesus "was taken up" in <u>Acts 1:9</u>.

We also see the delegation of authority given to the Apostles similar to <u>Matthew 16:18-19</u> in <u>John 20;21-23</u> when Jesus told them, "as my Father hath sent me, <u>so send I you</u>...whose soever sins ye remit, they are remitted (forgiven)...and whose soever sins ye retain, they are retained." It should be noted, too, that Jesus gave them a 'measure' of the Holy Spirit in this verse that would be similar to what Jesus did in <u>Luke 24:45</u> where He "opened their understanding that they may understand the scriptures."

<u>Hebrews 9:8</u> makes a comparison with the Innermost part of the Tabernacle, designed for God to "meet the High Priest there to accept the sacrifices offered by the shedding of blood." It is also stated to signify "the Holy Ghost." These sacrifices were designed to "Bring to remembrance the sins of the people" <u>Hebrews 10:3</u> under the Old Law, "while the Tabernacle was yet standing." However, in <u>Acts 1:4-5</u> Jesus "commanded them (the Apostles) that they should not depart from Jerusalem...and to wait for the promise of the Father...ye shall be baptized with the Holy Ghost not many days hence."

The purpose of the Holy Ghost was to facilitate the establishment of the New Covenant in Christ, and complete the Plan for salvation in the 'New Dispensation'. The sacrifice of Christ paid the price, without which the Plan could not occur. However, it was God's Plan to put in place this New Covenant under which men could find salvation through the blood of Christ by obedience of Faith. This is evident by John 7:39 which captures time between the resurrection of Christ and the coming of the Holy Spirit to complete the Plan.

- All our security cameras are working fine again. The cable on one of them had been chewed through by a (probably) a squirrel.
- A PA system for the fellowship hall has been purchased an stored in the fellowship hall for future use.
- There was nothing new to report on the proposed mission trip to Idaho.

- A new over-the-ear mic was purchased for Park, but the results are mixed, we'll be experimenting to find the best sound for the church building and the streaming broadcast.

- A new drainage system to avoid auditorium flooding has been built and seems to be working well.

FLIES IN THE OINTMENT

his past week's reading has included the book of Ecclesiastes. I hope you've been keeping up with a daily Bible reading — the one published and available in the foyer (and published in the bulletin) or one of your own choosing (there are lots of them that are available). But Ecclesiastes is a unique book in all the Bible in that it is certainly full of God's wisdom, it is also pretty philosophical and in some places just a little depressing — that is, if your focus is mostly on this world, because the prevailing theme throughout the book is that all this stuff "under the sun" is vanity and useless.

But in the midst of this tour de force on the vain value of the material versus the spiritual are little nuggets of wisdom that can provoke some real meditation. One of those is found in Ecclesiastes 10:1

Dead flies make a perfumer's oil stink, so a little foolishness is weightier than wisdom and honor.

What does this mean? Well, it is a proverb and so it can have a number of applications to practical living, but it seems to me that one of the most important applications is how truth compromised with even a little bit of foolishness (sin or a lie) can make the truth become false or (regarding a good program) the entire effort displeasing to God.

A stench in the nostrils of God is the common result, when we decide to add the "dead flies" of men's opinions, tastes, or wisdom to God's superlative truth and perfect commands. Granted, God has given us some leeway on how we are to obey some of His commands, but even the leeway has its limits and parameters.

Jeroboam famously changed a few things that seemed changeable to him, but the "dead flies" of his changes (also known as the sin of Jeroboam) resulted in a stench in what would have otherwise been pleasing scent to the nose of God

Tongue speaking was a God-given gift to the first century Christians and sometimes it was useful in worship — when there was an interpreter (1 Corinthians 14:27, 28). But the Corinthians thought that tongue speaking was such a wonderful thing that they began to turn worship into an all-tongues all the time kind of thing. They must have reasoned, "Surely God is still receiving praise, prayers are still being offered; it's only a small thing, right?" But the "dead flies" of an inappropriate use of gift the tongues resulted, Paul said, was a foul smell to the Lord.

The rabbis of Jesus' day felt certain that the additional "clarifications" to the Law that they offered were perfectly acceptable additions. But Jesus was quite critical of the additions which only provided loopholes to disobey God's law or falsely transformed the mere opinions of men into laws of God. To the Lord, the additions ruined the perfume of His holy law.

And we must also be careful to avoid "dead flies" in our offerings of worship to God or in our teaching of His word. The problem with "dead flies", of course, is that they don't look like "dead flies" to us. They often look like good ideas, fresh approaches, effective plans, or at least just harmless additions. But we must be discerning and realize that man's wisdom is not God's wisdom, man's desires are not God's desires, and man's "nose" is not God "nose".

If we are intent on pleasing our husband/wife or boyfriend/girlfriend we will be careful about showers, putting on deodorant, and applying a perfume/cologne pleasing to the object of our affection. Nobody wants to see a pained look and wrinkled nose on the face of someone we want to please. If we love the Lord as we claim to do, will we not also be careful to present to Him a "pleasing aroma" in our worship, our teachings, and our lives?
