#### GOD'S PLAN — PART 20

To investigate the Lord's church requires much study of the New Testament, as well as the foretelling of the 'coming of the church' in the Old Testament. The primary beginning of the church is linked to Abram's promise in *Genesis 12:1-8*. Remember that *Galatians 3:16* gives clarification to the promise, including that the 'seed promise' is in Christ. Therefore, it can be said that the Plan of God was unique and even mysterious as the Scriptures indicate. The presence of religions was vast with a wide variety of beliefs. The challenge of finalizing a *"God sponsored means by which man could be redeemed"* could only have been the product of Almighty God Himself.

The Roman government was in power in Jerusalem as early as 63 BC. Their attitude concerning Religion should be considered loose, provided it didn't interfere with the Law or the government hierarchy. The Christian believers were considered "just another religious sect" until it was challenged by the Jewish leaders. The clashes between the Jews and Christians apparently became serious for the Roman leaders. From the beginning of the church in 33 AD until 313 AD, Christianity was "forbidden by Roman Law". Under ruler Constantine was issued the 'Edict of Milan' which granted legal status to virtually all religions.

The Lord's Church remained a religious sect in the mind of the average person. Only those closest to Jesus himself would have imagined otherwise ...and only those lead by the Holy Spirit would recognize the difference! In the year 325 AD, Constantine called a meeting known as the 'Council of Nicea'. The purpose was to determine the "agreed-upon beliefs of the council". This may be the 1st time an effort was made to formalize and solidify religious beliefs by rulers of Governmental authority. In 380 AD, then ruler Theodosius issued the "Edict of Thessalonica" which made Nicene Christianity the 'official religion of the Roman Empire'. Those who were not in compliance would lose their "legal status".

Actually, there was little difference between then and now in terms of Spiritual Truth. It was during this time that the Inspired writers composed the entirety of the New Testament, and True Worshippers (*John 4:24*) continued to follow. *Matthew 7:13* refers to the "strait gate and narrow way, and few there be that find it". There is a reason for that, and we must make every effort to comply. More to follow

## HOW CAN I GET MORE OUT OF COMMUNION IN WORSHIP? (PART 1)

ne of the potentially richest and most meaningful acts of worship each first day of the week is the Lord's Supper. I say "potentially", because we can sometimes lose proper focus on it and thus partake of it in an unworthy fashion. This is not just a modern problem, of course; even Christians in Corinth needed a reminder to avoid taking it in a ho-hum fashion (1 Cor. 11:17ff). So, as a part of our series of articles how to get more out of worship, let's take a look at a few things to remember, so that we partake of it in a way that glorifies the Lord and builds us up individually and as a congregation.

First, we need to recall Jesus' own words about the elements of the Supper, the bread and the wine. The bread, Jesus said, is a token of His body, which was given in sacrifice to be physically punished and put to death to pay for the rightful punishment for our sins. Every

lash of the scourge belongs to us, every punch landed belonged to us, every wound, every nail, every bruise belonged to us, but He stood in our place and accepted them all in His body, which the bread represents. To partake of it should remind us that we are sinners, who have been infinitely benefited from His gracious standing in our place (Isaiah 53:4-6), which should provoke renewed love and gratitude in our hearts.

The cup, Jesus said, is to the Christian a token of His "blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for forgiveness of sins". Covenants in the Bible are often sealed with the blood of an animal sacrifice (Abram and Moses for example). And the new is also established with the blood of a sacrifice, although in this case, not with an animal's blood, but with Jesus' blood. No wonder, then, that the Hebrew writer wrote,

"Anyone who has set aside the Law of Moses dies without mercy on the testimony of two or three witnesses. How much severer punishment do you think he will deserve who has trampled under foot the Son of God, and has regarded as unclean the blood of the covenant by which he was sanctified, and has insulted the Spirit of grace?" (Heb. 10:29).

Being in covenant with God means becoming His adopted children, the reason why we may call the God of the universe our Father, an honor of

beyond our ability to completely comprehend!

But beyond the covenant aspect, we are told that Jesus' blood was poured out for forgiveness of sins. The Old Testament explained it, "For the life of the flesh is in the blood, and I have given it to you on the altar to make atonement for your souls; for

it is the blood by reason of the life that makes atonement" (Lev. 17:11). As we partake of the wine, we are to remember that the forgiveness of our sins came at the price of the life of the Son of God.

This facet of divine remembrance for all that the Lord has done, while we partake of the Lord's Supper is a crucial one. I tend to call it the vertical dimension, between God and us. If we focus on getting this right, every first day of the week, we will surely walk away renewed and spiritually nourished.

But there's also an horizontal dimension to the Lord's Supper that shouldn't be neglected, if we want to get the most out of worship. Let's talk about that next time.
