GOD'S PLAN — PART 23

One of the more interesting facts that have come from this extended study of God's Plan has changed my perspective of chronology. Obviously, the writing of the Old Testament took place *before* the writing of the New Testament...however, the announcement of the New Testament Plan came as early as *Genesis 3:15*, prior to any of the Old Testament documents, or the records that were recorded "for our learning".

God, in His wisdom, indicated far in advance that the ultimate solution was "to seek and save that which was lost" **Luke 19:10**. What God did was identify the Plan to redeem the creation of man by the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ. This was the message given to mankind through the Prophets in **Hebrews 1:1** over a period of many years. Historically, we can trace the promise to Abram in the year 2,091 BC that "through thy (his) seed, all families of the earth would be blessed" **Genesis 12:1-5.** The objective of the promise is clarified in **Galatians 3:16** "He sayeth not, to seeds as of many, but as of one, and to thy seed which is Christ."

For over 2,000 years, Prophets and righteous men "have desired to see those thing that ye see...and hear those things that ye hear, but have not..." <u>Matthew 13:17.</u> Only God can understand why He prolonged the coming of Christ for this length of time. We are given <u>Galatians 4:4</u> "when the fullness of time had come..." but no further explanation has been provided.

The faith of a believer leads us to accept the things written as designed and preserved by God Himself. It is further confirmed by the "inspired writings" which were prophesied, monitored and controlled as we can attest to in hind-sight which is known to be 'perfect vision'. This is the perspective of the Christian today; the accounts of the inspired writers were not recorded on the day they occurred, but from 17 – 67 years later! The plan of God was this miraculous. Jesus told His Apostles, "tarry in Jerusalem until ye be endued with power from on high"...this would be the giving of the Holy Ghost who would "bring all things to your remembrance whatsoever I have spoken to you" John 14:26. The New Testament was not a 'model' from the Old Testament...the Old Testament was the precursor for the New Testament to reveal God's Plan for salvation in Christ.



HOW CAN I GET MORE OUT OF PREACHING IN WORSHIP?

f the several things that happen in worship each Sunday, the one that takes up most of the time is the preaching of God's word, the sermon. So, how does a worshipful Christian get the most out of the preaching portion of the worship service?

First, come to the worship service rested and ready to hear and think about God's word. This has already been mentioned in previous articles, but it deserves repetition, because Sunday is preceded by what is commonly considered a play day, and we sometimes like to "play hard". So make an effort to get to bed on time, lest we "worship our play and play at our worship".

Beyond that, bring an eager mind. An eager mind wants to hear what God's word says, wants to hear about God's salvation, our hope, and the words of Jesus. It seeks and anticipates discovering the deep, sometimes challenging, and always practical meanings behind the histories, the parables, the prophecies, the psalms, the wisdom, and the letters in Scripture.

Avoid distractions, when possible. Distractions will happen in any assembly, but don't let it pull you away from the sermon. Kids will sometimes play or make noise — that's OK. There will almost always be those who need to make a bathroom run, that's OK, too. Sometimes a brother or sister on medication nods off, that's to be expected. Occasionally the preacher will mispronounce a word (sounds pretty familiar to me), he's human, too. Just don't let the distractions distract you too much. By the way, although the most popular seats are often in the back, the best place to **not** be distracted is in the front.

The people getting the most out of a sermon are usually the ones taking notes. Taking notes helps in the processing of information in any setting, because you have to put the many words heard into a few words on a page — any serious student will attest to this. Additionally, after the sermon and during the rest of the week you have something to look back on and think about later.

Be sure to turn to the passages of Scripture that are cited in the sermon. Despite the fact that the Scriptures are sometimes shown on the presentation

screen, it's always best to put your own eyes on the Scriptures. Perhaps mark the passage or put a note beside it, if you think it especially meaningful.

Also realize that every sermon will have something useful to you, even if it isn't your favorite Bible subject. The assembly of the church will have brethren of every maturity and knowledge level and the preacher is tasked by the Lord to attempt to feed them all. So some lessons will be milk and some will be meat. Sermons that remind you of things you already know are just as good as sermons that present new material to you. The New Testament is full of such reminders (Romans 15:15, 1 Corinthians 4:17, 2 Timothy 1:6, 2 Timothy 2:14 2 Peter 1:12, and others). Mankind has the terrible tendency to forget lessons of the past and need constant reminders. So don't discount a sermon that starts off with familiar themes, it will turn out to be handier that you may think. And sermons that are over your head can stretch and grow you, too; drink the milk and long for the meat. No matter your maturity level or knowledge level, there will always be something good to glean from every lesson. Welcome both kinds and grow! We live in a world in which we can just change the channel, if we don't like the program; but that choosiness may not be what our souls really need.

After services, do yourself and others a favor by discussing the lesson with family or friends over lunch. Indeed, if you had trouble gleaning something from the sermon, you will find this suggestion especially useful. You might be surprised at what others got out of the sermon that you might have missed or not thought about personally. Discussion surfaces things you didn't think of and helps imbed the lesson deeper into the memory.

Lastly, think about how to apply the lesson to yourself — *yourself* being the main, operative word here. It's easy to apply it to others, but it's always more important to tend to our own life, our own salvation, and get the log out of our own eyes before we start looking for sawdust in someone else's eyes.

So much of the spiritual encouragement of the assembly is found in the sermon, so make the effort to get as much as you can out of it
