GOD'S PLAN — PART 20

As we think about the number of 'churches' that exist today, it is normal to consider why they all exist and from where they have all come. Although the answer to this question may be perplexing, it becomes more clearly with a simple review of historical data. In the pursuit of truth, we must first consider what we know as fact. To do so, we can overlay biblical 'truth' with historical data that is considered acceptable public knowledge.

Our first thought must be as Isaiah wrote in <u>Isaiah</u> <u>30:8</u>, "Now go, write it before them in a table, and note it in a book, that it may be for a time to come for ever and ever." The idea of inspired scripture began long before the New Testament was written, and the idea was obvious; to provide and conserve the Plan of God that would be <u>"evident and everlasting"</u>.

Over the past 19 weeks, we have been reviewing deliberate testimony regarding the Plan of God. We will continue this path until we have covered enough undeniable evidence from God's Word to help every individual be prepared to "give an answer to every man that asketh for a reason of the hope that is in you" <u>I Peter 3:15</u>. Not only that we are able to 'give an answer' but that we are well informed of our responsibility for the Christian walk in the world today.

As indicated in *Genesis 3:15*, there is a well-documented conflict to occur between good and evil. A great amount of this conflict is between the "chosen people of God" and the prevailing government under whom the Jewish nation was to exist. At the time that Jesus walked upon the earth, the Roman government was in power. As indicated by Biblical references over and again, the Roman government officials were sensitive about the "King of the Jews" that had been prophesied for centuries as the Messiah who was to come.

The struggle between the people and the government was for both power and authority. The vast numbers of the children of Israel had been an issue for centuries, and even lead to their Egyptian bondage in *Exodus 1:7-12*. This is recorded historically between 1500-1600 BC. As a contrast, Jerusalem was conquered by the Romans around 63 BC. We will see how this influenced the Plan of God next week.



HOW CAN I GET MORE OUT OF PRAYERS IN WORSHIP?

Worship, you see, is much

more than a performance

to attend; it is something

to do...

worship, you see, is much more than a performance to attend; it is something to do, to participate in, and to personally offer in the assembly. And this is an especially important thing to remember when it comes to a couple of the avenues of worship, the preaching and the prayers. The reason why is sort of obvious, because we are silent during the preaching and the prayers; but though the assembly is quiet during those

avenues of worship, it doesn't mean that we stop participating. Let's apply this idea especially to prayer and offer some ways in which we can get more out of our worship to the Lord.

Let me start by pointing out that corporate prayer, prayers prayed by the whole church in the assembly, is es-

pecially effective. Once, when the earliest brethren prayed together in Acts 4:31, the Scripture tells us, "And when they had prayed, the place where they had gathered together was shaken..." God will shake up the world, when we pray together, fervently, and in faith.

Next let me speak to those who lead prayers. Prayer leaders, please remember that, different from a personal prayer full of personal matters, you are leading a prayer for the whole congregation in worship to God. It should include praise for God, thanks to God, and petitions to God. And your prayer, as in all prayers, should be *addressed to* the Father (John 15:16), but prayed *through* the Son, in Jesus' name (John

15:16) — Jesus is our mediator (1 Timothy 2:5), the one through whom our prayers are presented to God the Father.

For the rest of us, let us keep in mind that this prayer is being "led", that is to say that the prayer leader is wording a prayer for us all to be praying — because, again, it isn't a performance to simply be endured by the gathered Christians, and the way that one participates is to listen carefully and be led in your heart by what is being said at the pulpit.

And one way to keep reverent focus in

prayer is to remember that the Lord is in our midst as we worship. Picture in your mind the presence of God with us in the assembly. The Lord is the unseen but very present host of every worship service (Mathew 18:20). It is not just another gathering, it is a gathering

in which the Lord is present in a special way.

Another way to participate is to offer an "amen" either silently, quietly, or aloud to various portions of the prayer. The meaning of the Hebrew word "amen" is (depending on the context) "yes" or "may it be so". Thus, participating with an "amen" can help keep out minds from wandering.

Yet another way to get more out of prayer in the worship of God is to give a prayer leader a special request. This congregation offers an opportunity for just such things every week, and God has answered our prayers time and again.

There is much to be gained from prayer in worship. Don't cheat yourself by neglecting it.
