### GOD'S PLAN — PART 17

Over the past sixteen weeks, we have been writing about the "Plan of God for salvation." The primary objective has been to reinforce the Plan that God made for redemption. There is only one reason for this, and that is to identify how the Plan was intended. It is easy to simplify the Plan by suggesting salvation came when Christ died for us upon the cross. Prophets spoke of a virgin birth, death by crucifixion, and an everlasting kingdom. Few details were provided in prophesy, but confirmed by inspired writers in their generations (respectively) in the Old Testament records.

The historical facts we can know in hindsight reveal details that pertain to us today. This is where the Plan materializes in the New Testament writings, beginning with John the Baptist. *Mark 1:2-3.* "Behold, I send my messenger before thy face which shall prepare thy way before thee." We should also consider *Galatians 4:4-5,* "When the fullness of time was come, God sent forth His Son, made of a woman, made under the Law, to redeem them that were under the Law.

The birth, death and resurrection of Jesus is the proclamation of the 'GOSPEL', *I Corinthians 15:1-4*. Had it not been for His sacrifice, the Plan for Salvation would never have been completed, nor would have God's Plan for salvation been put into effect! It is also true that none of us on this side of the Cross received salvation on the day of His resurrection, nor did we receive salvation when He was announced "exalted" in *Acts 2:33*. The first example of the application of God's Plan was provided in great detail on the Day of Pentecost, AD33. The scriptural pattern for salvation was made known by example; Hear-Believe-Repent-Confess-Baptized for the remission of sin.

Although it occurred in the year AD 33, it was only recorded as written instruction for righteousness a minimum of 17 years later. This too, was included in the Plan of God. Although quoted many times in Scripture, Jesus did not write a single Word of Truth. The fulfillment of *Matthew 16:18-19* was provided in the writings of Inspired men...who received by the Holy Spirit, "what they should say and what they should speak." *John 12:49*, as Jesus indicated by the delegation thereof. Yes, the Plan for Salvation is unique and quite mysterious as Paul described it in *Ephesians 3:1-11*, and exclusive to God's Salvation!

## WHAT'S THE BIG DEAL ABOUT ATTENDING CHURCH SERVICES?

n Wednesday's Bible studies, we've been considering a lot of questions from the class. Sometimes the questions are those class students have and other questions are ones that friends have. This past Wednesday we discussed the question: "Why should I attend church services? I can worship God out in the wilderness by myself". But the the answer to this question merits more than a class to only a few members of the church who attend just about everything anyway, because we live in a time in which public opinion is trending toward a "give me Jesus, but you can keep the church" mentality. Many folks these days believe that church attendance is optional. But is it? What does the Scripture say?

Let's start with Hebrews 10:23-25...

Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful; and let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds, not forsaking our own assembling together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another; and all the more as you see the day drawing near.

Just by reading this one passage, we can see that assembling as a church is not a option, but a command. "Let us" is a phrase that is a command in an exhortation form..."hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering" and "not forsaking our own assembling together". Most first century Christians understood this and came together on Sundays (Acts 20:7), though some were beginning to "skip" (Hebrews 10:25).

Someone may say, "Well, I haven't exactly forsaken it, as in never coming back; I come to the assembly several times a year." In the Hebrews 10 context the word forsaken clearly means to choose something else over the assembly as a **habit**, which is exactly what a several times a year attendance record would be. The exception would attending, and the habit would be forsaking.

And staying with Hebrews 10:23-24, we can see that the idea of "worshipping God by ourselves in the wilderness" has some serious problems, too. Notice that part of the reason for assembly is to "stimulate one another to love and good deeds" and "encouraging one another". "One another" clearly indicates things that are not done by ourselves in the wilderness. You see, proper Christian worship is not just "vertical", not just between you and God. Proper Christian worship also includes a "horizontal" aspect, a "one another" dimension, a "brother's keeper" angle that cannot be fulfilled by ourselves alone in the wilderness (or fishing lake, hiking trail, motorcycle route, etc.). Every act of worship (singing, praying, preaching, communion, and giving) has both a vertical and horizontal facet: glorifying God, and also edifying (encouraging) the church. And regarding this last facet of worship, the inspired apostle Paul said, "Let all things be done for edification" (1 Corinthians 14:26). The command to edify, build up, and encourage one another is a part of, and just as binding on the Christian as, the command to assemble.

"Well, thanks, but I'm spiritually strong enough not to need to be encouraged or edified," someone might say. First, let me humbly beg to differ on that point; I don't know of anyone who is that strong. But second, if you are really that spiritually strong, you owe some strengthening to the rest of us, who aren't, as a brother's keeper. Either way, as the saint who needs the encouragement or the strong soul who needs no encouragement, you need to be here.

The short answer to this question is that the modern trend away from church attendance is wrong, because it ignores God's command to assemble. Next week: how to get more from the assembly of the church in worship. several
