## Spiritual Tidbits A Great Nation

The measure of time as we know it has little value to our Heavenly Father (*1 day is as a thousand years <u>2 Peter 3:8</u>*).

The Plan that God had originated at the Fall of Man in Genesis 3 would be completed upon a timetable that only He would know. Nothing would be left out until all was fulfilled. Remember the message to Jacob in <u>Genesis 28:15</u> "I will keep thee in all places whither thou goest, and will bring thee again unto this land (Canaan); for <u>I will not leave thee, until I have</u> <u>done that which I have spoken to thee of.</u>" (the unkept portion of the Promise made earlier to both Abraham and Isaac)

The path would lead the children of Israel back to Canaan, but by way of Egypt beginning about 1876 BC. Although Jacob had 12 sons, each becoming the 'head' of their respective Tribes, not all would have significant roles in God's Plan. Joseph was the 11<sup>th</sup> son that the older brothers despised and sold into slavery to the Ishmaelites (descendants of Ishmael, son of Abram and Hagar). Joseph would later explain to his brothers in <u>Genesis 45:4-18</u>, that it was always God's plan to bring Joseph to Egypt in order to prepare the way for the tremendous blessings promised to all 12 Tribes in <u>Genesis 12</u> <u>& 13</u> of great status, wealth and number as 'the chosen people of God'.

Please note the message given by God to Jacob in <u>Gene-</u> <u>sis 28:12-15</u> (Jacob's Ladder). Although the original Promise was made to Abram, this is a clarification to Jacob elaborating more specific information regarding God's intent. To fully understand how this would happen, look back to <u>Genesis</u> <u>15:13-14</u>, God said to Abram, "thy seed shall be a stranger in a land that is not theirs, and shall serve them; and they shall afflict them...and also that nation, whom they shall serve, will I judge...and afterward, shall they come out with great substance."

God made clear to Jacob, that the Promise made first to Abram would be fulfilled in Jacob's generation as they were preparing to join Joseph in Egypt; <u>Genesis 46:3-4</u>, "I am God, the God of thy father: fear not to go down into Egypt: for I will there make of thee a great nation: I will go down with thee into Egypt; and I will surely bring thee up again..."

### WHERE DID THE POPE COME FROM?

ust recently the Catholic Church appointed a new Pope, Leo XIV. There has been a great deal of coverage about it in the news and a lot of pomp and ceremony surrounding his appointment. Included in the news coverage there has been the repeated statement that the new Pope is the new successor to the apostle Peter, "the first Pope". But is this statement, and many of the others about apostolic succession, really historically accurate or are we hearing the cumulative sum of traditions, rationalizations, and dogma? What does history and the Scripture say?

The primary scripture the Catholic Church gives for justifying a Pope is Matthew 16:18-19. This passage in many translations reads similar to this: "18 And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. 19 I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven" (ESV). On first blush it would seem that Peter is apparently being identified as the rock upon which the church would be built and that he is being given authority to bind and loose whatever he deems appropriate. But these arguments, upon closer examination, prove false.

First, in v. 18 Jesus is calling Peter *petros*, the Greek for a smallish stone that you can throw, but the rock upon which the church will be build is *petras*, which is the Greek word for ledge rock, something large enough to build a house on (see Matt. 7:24,25). The *petras* upon which the church was built was not Peter (*petros*), but the confession of faith in Jesus as the Son of God. The keys to the kingdom that Peter was given refers not to supreme earthly authority, but rather to his honor to open the door to the kingdom by preaching the very first Gospel sermon, to which 3000 souls responded in baptism (Acts 2).

Secondly, when many translations read "whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven"; it should really read: "I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; and whatever you bind on earth **shall have been bound** (*future perfect passive*) in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth **shall have been loosed** (*future perfect passive*) in heaven" (NASB95). This deficient translation that many Bible carry gives Peter the authority to make rules, and asserts that God would simply approve; but the more accurate translation says that it is the Lord who will first approve and then the Peter would (and the other apostles — see Matthew 18:18) then teach it.

In fact, it would appear that rather than Peter being the leader of the early church, James, the brother of Jesus, also known as James the Just, exercised greater influence in the early church than Peter (note: Acts 12:17 / Acts 15:13 / Acts 21:18).

Moreover, there is no biblical precedent for human leadership above the local eldership (a plurality of elders) apart from the apostles. The apostles, however, were only a temporary gift to the church, since a requirement for being an apostle was to be an eye witness of His resurrection. Obviously, everyone who saw the resurrected Christ has died, consequently, the apostolic office and its universal authority in the church has ceased to be. Since the time when the last apostle died (approximately AD 100, the only true universal authority over the Lord's churches (congregations) is the Bible, God's own inspired word.

The first century church's congregations were universally overseen by a plurality of local elders, whose job was to shepherd the flock of God. In time, however, things evolved; one elder often became more vocal and influential than the rest. That elder sometimes became known as the bishop and occasionally these bishops in a region would convene to talk about regional problems among the churches. In time, one of these bishops also became more influential (cardinals) and would also convene to discuss mutual problems and doctrinal questions. And so a hierarchy in leadership evolved, but it remained pretty much at the "cardinal level" for centuries, as different cardinals attempted to establish themselves as universal leaders of the church. Finally in AD 607 Emperor Phocas declared Boniface III the "bishop of Rome", and that "the See of Blessed Peter the Apostle [AKA Rome] should be the head of all the Churches"— the first official Pope.

The Bible gives no authority to a Pope. Jesus declared, "And Jesus came up and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth" (Matt. 28:18).
