"We're Here and We Care"

"I WILL SEE YOU AGAIN"

It is difficult to include everything at one time regarding the Plan of God for salvation, and certainly everything the Bible has to say regarding the Holy Spirit. However, in our search for the 'sum' of its meaning, we read and meditate upon the details that allow us the deepest understanding. II Timothy 2:15 explains this perfectly. If we have yet to make a concerted effort to study, it is unlikely we can reach our true potential as a Christian.

Imagine the burden of the Apostles, having spent time with Jesus, but remaining unclear on so many details. Now, imagine how much more they came to know when the Holy Spirit came upon them, and the answers to their questions became clear. There is an interesting discussion in John 16:16-28 between Jesus and the Apostles. It is worth your time and consideration.

As you read this, please remember that Jesus was at the right hand of the Father when John wrote these things down. You can be as certain of the accuracy and the content, as the Apostles were after Pentecost. Jesus makes reference to his departure like this, "a little while and ye shall not see me...then again, ye shall see me." In verse 18, Jesus knows they do not understand, but hesitant to ask what He means. As the inspired writers often do, there is 'great wisdom' from the Father in what the Spirit has delivered to them.

Through verse 28, Jesus makes reference to at least two occasions in which he will leave and return; in the tomb and resurrection as well as His 2nd coming. There is also further indication of what is yet to come in the Plan of God. In Verses 22-25, Jesus said, "I will see you again... and in that day, you will ask me nothing...these things I have spoken unto you in proverbs; but the time cometh when I shall no more speak to you in proverbs, but I will show you plainly of the Father." Reading these words from Jesus Himself, picturing Him as friend sitting on a rock on the shore by the sea. As surely as He said these things for the Inspired writer to record, they are intended to sink deeply into our hearts, and bring us closer to our heavenly Father and the Savior who gave His life for us.

THE DANGERS OF TRADITIONS

esus often condemned the imposition of traditions upon the apostles and the Jewish people in His ministry on earth."BUT IN VAIN DO THEY WORSHIP ME, TEACHING AS DOCTRINES THE PRECEPTS OF MEN" (Matt. 15:9).

On the other hand, the inspired apostle Paul spoke positively about the traditions he had handed down to the churches (1 Cor. 11:2 and 2 Thess. 2:15 and 3:6).

So which is it? Are traditions good or bad? The key lies in what kind of authority they are being given. Notice the objection that Jesus had to the traditions what that they were being taught by uninspired men as inspired doctrines or commands from God. The traditions that Paul was teaching, on the other hand, were authorized by God and may have included, for example, teachings about assembling every first day of the week for worship and the Lord's Supper. This was part of Jesus plan of inspiring and authorizing the apostles to teach and set a lot of the details of the church, Christian behavior, and doctrine —

"Truly I say to you, whatever you bind on earth shall have been bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall have been loosed in heaven" (Matt. 18:18)

and

"But when He, the Spirit of truth, comes, He will guide you into all the truth; for He will not speak on His own initiative, but whatever He hears, He will speak; and He will disclose to you what is to come" (John 16:13).

But today we have no more inspired men to set doctrine and morality; instead, we have the Bible, the inspired word of God to teach us His immutable truth. Yet men still make and often hold to traditions. While some of them are can be harmless (e.g., an established time and place for the church to meet), the truth is that they can still be dangerous and become sin when men try to bind them as God's commands.

They can become the sources of false doctrine. Church history is replete with examples of innocent behaviors that became established habits that became calcified traditions that became matters of doctrine. For example, a preference for an unmarried evangelist (like Paul) became more than a preference and ultimately became a command in some religious groups to be celibate.

Another danger is the false guilt that such traditions generate among those upon whom the traditions are being bound. This is what Jesus was

specifically objecting to, when the Pharisees accused His disciples of breaking the sabbath by picking heads of grain and eating them. Had the Lord not been there to defend His disciples, the disciples would probably have slunk off in guilty shame, because they

had "sinned". There's plenty of legitimate guilt regarding legitimate sins; there's no need to generate new reasons to feel guilty. Among some religious groups a tradition arose to abstain from meat on Fridays,

which over time morphed into a command that, if violated, needed confession and repentance — a false guilt based on a false sin.

Yet another danger of traditions is that they are often divisive. As opinions become traditions and traditions become increasingly established, it is not unusual for some in the congregation to disagree. For example, the order of a congregation's worship service frequently follows a weekly pattern, so that if a song leader or preacher attempts to change the order of worship (even though all parts of the worship have been included) an urgent concern will often arise that can develop to the point of a division.

Without doubt the biggest danger of traditions is that they subtly shift the authority for religion from God to men. But it is the Lord's word that will judge

And this is why Christians, from the leadership to the pew, need to be able to differentiate tradition from command and recognize what can and often times does go wrong, when a harmless tradition starts to become a doctrine or a command.

Let us always be careful to speak where the Bible speaks and be silent where the Bible is silent.
