


THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE



LUKE 21

THE WIDOW'S MITES (VV. 1-4)

PART 1 OF THINGS TO COME (VV. 7 - 38)

Double Prophecy

One of the more misunderstood portions of the Gospels is this prophecy from Jesus found here in Luke and also in Matthew 24 and Mark 13. The confusion is centered around whether it is referring to the destruction of Jerusalem (which occurred in 70 AD, approximately 40 years later) or about the end of time. Clearly, Jesus is talking about them both, but how can you discern whether He is talking about one or the other? The threads of the destruction of Jerusalem (and the Temple) seem to be intertwined with the threads of prophecy about the end of time in a way that makes it difficult to know what prediction applies to which event. While there are clearly some mysteries (prophecies that are given only in vague, veiled forms) in this prophecy, the secret to untangling things here is a prophetic style or device called "double prophecy", which can be found in many of Old Testament prophets. Essentially, it is one prophecy with two or more fulfillments. Some of the elements of the prophecy are true of both, but some of the elements apply to only one.

The following are a few examples...

- 2 Sam.7:11-17 — The prophet, Nathan, gives David the promise of a son (referring to Solomon) who would continue David's kingdom and build a house for the Lord (the Jerusalem Temple), instead of David. In another sense, the prophecy also referred to the Messiah, Jesus, who would both sit on David's throne and build God's house (the church). One prophecy, two fulfillments.
- Isaiah is full of such prophecies; for example, Isa. 25, Isa. 33:17-24, Isa. 35, Isa. 40:1-8, and Isa. 52:1-12. The Remnant prophecies are often double prophecies in Isaiah, speaking of the return of the nation of Israel from captivity, but also referring to the church as the Gentiles stream from the nations to Zion.
- Jeremiah has double prophecies, too; for example, Jer. 23:5-8 and Jer. 31.
- Daniel's prophecy in Dan. 12, especially as it refers to the "abomination of desolation" (in reference to the destruction of the Temple in AD 70 and the evil times at the end of time), is another double prophecy.

There are others that could be cited, but hopefully these above examples will suffice to illustrate 1) how double prophecy works and 2) that it is a relatively common means of revealing God's plans for the future while also concealing some things that God wants to keep as mysteries. In many ways it is similar to "type and antitype" also seen in Scripture: Melchizedek / Jesus, Israel / the church, Babylon / Rome / the wicked capital of worldliness.

Looking at Parallel Passages

One way of studying this passage is to look also at the other Gospel passages that tell of this prophecy from Jesus. So, we'll be providing both Matthew 24 and Mark 13 in addition to a column of Luke 21 in this study. Our focus will be on Luke 21, but comparison with the other Gospels will give us more information than any one of them by itself.

(LUKE 21:5-36)

5 And while some were talking about the temple, that it was adorned with beautiful stones and votive gifts, He said,

6 "As for these things which you are looking at, the days will come in which there will not be left one stone upon another which will not be torn down."

7 They questioned Him, saying, "Teacher, when therefore will these things happen? And what will be the sign when these things are about to take place?"

(MATTHEW 24:1-44)

1 Jesus came out from the temple and was going away when His disciples came up to point out the temple buildings to Him.

2 And He said to them, "Do you not see all these things? Truly I say to you, not one stone here will be left upon another, which will not be torn down."

3 As He was sitting on the Mount of Olives, the disciples came to Him privately, saying, "Tell us, when will these things happen, and what will be the sign of Your coming, and of the end of the age?"

8 And He said, "See to it that you are not misled; for many will come in My name, saying, 'I am He,' and, 'The time is near.' Do not go after them.

9 "When you hear of wars and disturbances, do not be terrified; for these things must take place first, but the end does not follow immediately."

(MARK 13:1-37)

1 As He was going out of the temple, one of His disciples *said to Him, "Teacher, behold what wonderful stones and what wonderful buildings!"

2 And Jesus said to him, "Do you see these great buildings? Not one stone will be left upon another which will not be torn down."

3 As He was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter and James and John and Andrew were questioning Him privately,

4 "Tell us, when will these things be, and what will be the sign when all these things are going to be fulfilled?"

5 And Jesus began to say to them, "See to it that no one misleads you.

6 "For many will come in My name, saying, 'I am He,' and will mislead many.

7 "When you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be frightened; those things must take place; but that is not yet the end.

8 "For nation will rise up against nation, and kingdom against kingdom, and in various places there will be famines, earthquakes. These things are merely the beginning of birth pangs.

36 "But keep on the alert at all times, praying that you may have strength to escape all these things that are about to take place, and to stand before the Son of Man."

35 "Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will not pass away.

37 "For the coming of the Son of Man will be just like the days of Noah.

38 "For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day that Noah entered the ark,

39 and they did not understand until the flood came and took them all away; so will the coming of the Son of Man be.

40 "Then there will be two men in the field; one will be taken and one will be left.

43 "But be sure of this, that if the head of the house had known at what time of the night the thief was coming, he would have been on the alert and would not have allowed his house to be broken into.

44 "For this reason you also must be ready; for the Son of Man is coming at an hour when you do not think He will.

35 "Therefore, be on the alert--for you do not know when the master of the house is coming, whether in the evening, at midnight, or when the rooster crows, or in the morning--

36 in case he should come suddenly and find you asleep.

37 "What I say to you I say to all, 'Be on the alert!'"
